

Amendment passed by County Board on 11/23/93

I. PRIVATE ROADS

The term "private road" shall refer to any unnamed road or trail that is not under the jurisdiction of the Township or County Road Commission, wherein there is already a minimum of six (6) developed parcels with potential for continued development. The act of naming and numbering neither infers or confers any legal status nor responsibility on the part of the township or county.

If there are less than six (6) developed parcels then no name will be assigned and the address will be given off the main road.

No land use permit will be issued by a local unit until an address has been assigned by the equalization department. Addresses will be assigned by the department for roads as defined herein and named by the local government with review and comment by Equalization and the County Road Commission.

Once a name has been approved for a private road and no conflicting name exists, the local government will notify the County Road Commission who will install and maintain the private road sign, charging the initial costs back to the developer or residents involved. Continued maintenance will be charged to the township. Sign color shall be contrasting, but not same as county road signs.
